Item 6.1:

Has a detailed recovery analysis been performed to quantify what is being billed vs what is being pumped? While this won't identify whether the loss is due to leaking supply pipes or malfunctioning meters it will quantify in gallons and dollars what the loss is vs the expenditure on new meters etc..

if the analysis hasn't been done it would just be a matter of reading the main meter, quickly reading all of the homeowner meters (do it on a Saturday midday when the school is closed and either shut off the main or just ask people to not use water for an hour or so) then do the same thing 30 days or so later. There will be some math as there are cubic ft meters and gallon meters.

In regards to Verizon boosters. We have one and it's effective but in a very short range and that is reliant on where the booster is located in relation to your modem. At our home we receive no Verizon signal within 40-50ft of our meter location even with a booster.

Item 7-2: as We have stated before we have no issue with rate increases but they must be a) justifiable based on detailed financial analysis showing projected cost increases, capital improvement projects that are mandatory to maintain system performance, and improving reserves for unforeseen emergencies. b) we know that the idea of tiered pricing has continually been dismissed as "insignificant and not worth it". We disagree. If the variable charge above baseline usage was at a point that was significant it would be worth it. If software is the holdup to this then change the software. The most impactful way to encourage conservation is to have the biggest users pay more per unit after a baseline allowance then those that use less.
